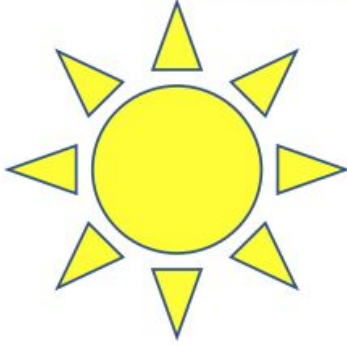
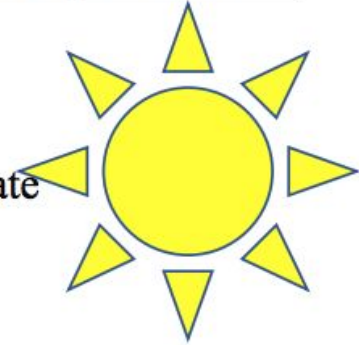


# Change Policy in Kansas for Third Party Purchase Agreements (PPAs)



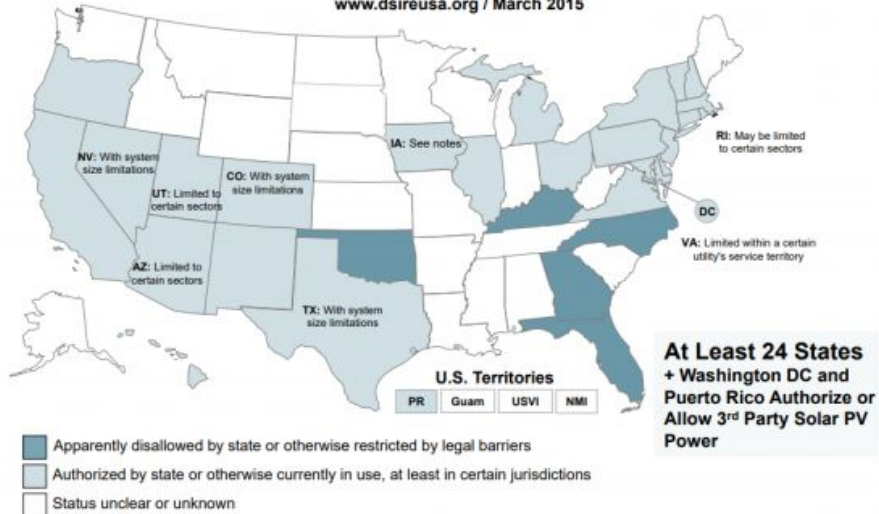
All Kansans deserve to participate in renewable energy!



- Leasing solar energy helps those that cannot afford to purchase their own solar system still reap the benefits of solar energy
- Maintenance, initial cost, and operations can be scary, but with the solar developer owning the system all those risks fall to them
- PPAs typically have a fixed rate for the energy so no need to worry about fluctuating prices through the life of the lease
